And even when it is not heard so often after the feast days – it's only because it has been engraved deeply in our hearts, moving them in accordance with this joyful ecclesiastical exclamation, encouraging us, as Apostle Paul says, "to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Eph. 2, 9), again, towards our families, neighbours, friends or enemies, for the country, city, town, village and neighbourhood; for the sake of the One who suffered, died on a Cross and truly is/has been risen!

## Paschal Message of His Holiness KIRILL, Patriarch of Moscow and All Russia

to the Archpastors, Pastors, Deacons, Monastics and All the Faithful Children of the





Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead (1 Pet. 1:3)

Your Eminences the archpastors, honourable fathers, venerable monks and nuns, dear brothers and sisters!

On this marvelous and high-honored day, filled with special joy about the risen from the tomb Lord Jesus, I warmly congratulate all of you on the great and world-saving feast of Pascha and I send you the ancient life-affirming greeting:

#### CHRIST IS RISEN!

Today the fullness of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church magnifies with the chants and the spiritual songs the resurrection from the dead of the Son of God and the Son of Man our Lord Jesus Christ, Who destroyed the power of death and opened for

us the door into His incorruptible Kingdom. In truth, today all is filled with light: heaven and earth, and the low regions; all creation celebrates the rising of Christ, in whom it is established (The Canon of Holy Pascha).

Like the myrrh-bearing women of the Gospel and other disciples of the Savior, who became the first witnesses of the resurrection, we are called to proclaim this great joy to people — those who are near and dear to us, those who surround us, those who we know. We say to them: Christ is risen! And like that time, many centuries ago, some of them, having believed, respond immediately: truly He is risen! Others, like the Apostle Thomas, doubt and say: "Unless I see Him myself, unless I touch Him, I will not believe (John 20:25).

The belief in the resurrection of the Lord Jesus is the unchangeable foundation, the unshakable pillar on which Christianity rests. "If Christ, having died, could not rise," says St. John Chrysostom, "then sin is not exterminated, and death is not conquered, <...> and not only we preached in vain, but you also believed in vain" (Homily 39 on 1st Corinthians).

By his redemptive deed, the Savior united Heaven and the Earth, the Eternal and the temporary, the Creator and the creature, God and man. He overcame the abyss that at the dawn of history separated the first people from their Creator. Through the violation of the commandment given to them, through their disobedience to the Creator, sin and death began to reign in the world. When, according to the word of the Apostle Paul, the fullness of the time had come, God, for our salvation, sent forth His Son, that we might receive the adoption as sons (Gal. 4: 4-5).

Christ, as a lamb without blemish and without spot, takes away the sin of the world (1 Pet. 1:19; John 1:29). Showing obedience to Heavenly Father to the point of death, even the death of the cross (Phil. 2: 8), He brings humanity to its Creator, reconciles it with Him. Being the Son of God by nature, He makes us sons of God by grace. The Lord reveals to us the path of moral transfiguration and spiritual ascent to eternal and blissful life with God in the never-ending day of His Kingdom (Canon of Holy Pascha).

Having freed us from slavery to sin, having crushed the power of the rulers of the darkness of this age, the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places (Ephesians 6:12), the Lord ascends into Heaven where He sits in the unapproachable glory at the right hand of the Pre-eternal Father. At the same time, He does not leave us here on earth, and is inseparable from His disciples, who together form His Body - the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. Christ, Her Head, leads this ship of salvation through the stormy waters of the sea of life into a quiet heavenly haven, where God will be all in all (1 Cor. 15:28).

Comprising the Holy Church, we Christians are the successors of His glorious mission in the world. Like the great multitude of our brothers and sisters in the faith, that have lived before us — the apostles, myrrhbearing women, martyrs, saints hierarchs, reverend and righteous, we are called to proclaim the name of the Lord, to make known His deeds among the peoples (1 Chron. 16: 8). We are called to preach about the Son of God and the Son of Man, who, through inexpressible love for us, shed His pure blood on the Cross for us. We are called both with words and deeds, with our whole life to witness to people about Him who was wounded and tortured for our iniquities (Isa. 53: 5) and raised to life to justify us (Rom. 4:25).

Dear brothers and sisters! I would like again and again with all my heart to congratulate you on the bright Feast of Feasts, and Triumph of Triumphs, the redeeming Pascha of God (Canon of Holy Pascha). As the holy Apostle John instructs us, let us love one another, for love is of God, Who loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. If God so loved us, we also ought to love one another (1 John 4: 7-11). May these marvelous words invariably be our guide on all the paths of life, may they inspire us to perform good deeds, to serve those who are near or afar of us. Amen.

This is the day, which the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it, for

#### /the beginning – in volume 4/

We do know the outward social laws and often we speak about them. However, should we also know the inward spiritual laws. Let's have a look at another one.

So, who is capable of seeing himself, what is the way to see himself? Well as far as I see myself, I am good enough... How can I see my need in Saviour?



There turns out to be a most surprising and important thing; the one who lives "according to the basic principles of the world" (Col. 2, 8), who does not make himself to live according to the commandments (Certainly I mean the commandments of Gospel, compared to which the commandments of Moses are quite primitive) i.e. if one does not guard his thoughts, feelings and desires...

So, living according to the world, thus living a sinful life, dreaming airily of about anything and having any kind of feelings, doing what he likes... nothing special as it seems to be on the surface... actually – this is living in this whirlpool. Never he will see himself a sinner! This is a striking phenomenon!

By the way it is another startling evidence of the degree of our fallenness. I cannot see my sin unless I live in this atmosphere of sin. That is why the one who wants to see Christ, i.e. to get to know his need in Christ must go out of this unbearably stuffy atmosphere where you can cut the air with a knife.

And indeed, unless the one leaves this room never he will see where he was. Thus self-knowledge, as it turns out, is necessary for man. What is the way to get it?

Let's listen to the golden words of saint Simeone the New Theologian, which I am going to slightly rephrase to make it clear: "A whole-hearted effort to fulfill the commandments reveals to man his actual, authentic state."

He did say a bit differently: "Painstaking fulfillment of Christ's commandments teaches man about his infirmity" (4:9) But we'd better say "an effort" than "fulfillment" as unfortunately this would be more up to reality. Moreover, it reveals not only infirmities but also man's sins, passions and, if you like, impotence to live the way Christ calls upon us.

By the way here is an advice saint Ignatius Brianchaninov gives us: "If one refuses to judge his neighbors, his thoughts naturally begin to see his own sins and weaknesses, which he did not see while he was occupied with the judgment of his neighbors" (5:351) What a witty advice! One must literally grasp and hold himself from doing this! Stop! Stop and take a look at yourself, dear!

Thus, my friends this is a main truth I'm going to remind you a hundred more times.

And unless we stick to it there is no Christianity at all! And there'll be no Orthodoxy, no matter how many different church rewards you get...

Only knowledge of himself and humility and repentance, which come from this knowledge, can give birth to Faith in Christ. This is the only way.

August 4, 1937 – April 14, 2019




